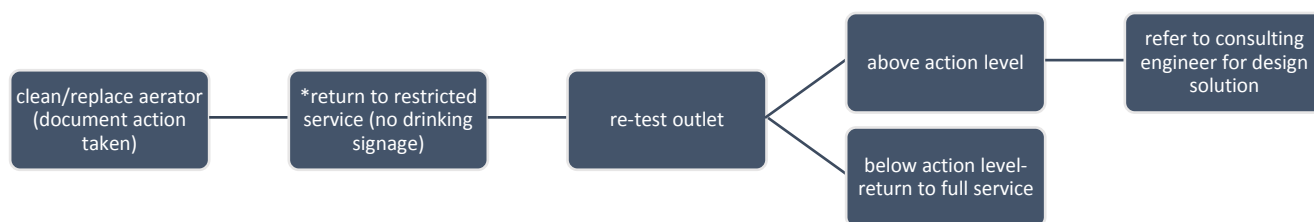

Lead in Drinking Water Remediation plan

Monticello Central School District conducted testing for lead in drinking water in accordance with emergency regulation titled: *Lead Testing in School Drinking Water* 10 NYCRR Subpart 67-4. This regulation requires school districts and boards of cooperative education services (BOCES) with municipal water supplies, and those classified as *public water systems under* 10 NYCRR Subpart 5-1, to test potable water outlets for the presence of lead contamination. Outlets with levels above the defined action level of 15 ppb were taken out of service or posted with *No Drinking* signage as soon as lab results were received and reviewed. The district's remediation efforts follow the framework described below.



*Restricted service applies only to handwashing and cleaning outlets

A 30 second flush sample may be collected in addition to a first draw sample during re-testing in an effort to determine if an outlet or an internal plumbing component is contributing to the elevated test result. In the event that aerator cleaning results in test results below the action level, a periodic aerator replacement procedure will be implemented by the district.
