MEMORIAL GRANTS-IN-AID AWARDS

Each year Tau Chapter of Delta Kappa Gamma Society gives two Grants-in-Aid Awards to senior girls who are entering the teaching profession. Only girls from schools where there presently are, or have been, Tau Chapter members are eligible.

The senior girls in each school who have indicated teaching as their career interest and are at least in the upper half of their class, should be informed of these awards and urged to apply for them.

All applications should be returned to the Guidance Counselor, who will choose one candidate whose serious intent is to enroll in the field of teaching. Members of Tau Chapter in your district may help in the final selection. We will consider only one application from each school and will not make choices if sent several applications and/or incomplete ones.

Selection of the candidate should be based on the following:

- Character
- Potential for teaching
- Personality
- Scholarship

The selected candidate's completed form, picture, transcript, and letter of recommendation should then be sent to the Chairman of the Professional Affairs Committee by April 18, 2018.

The final determination of the recipients of the awards will be made by the Tau Chapter Professional Affairs Committee who will use the same criteria for judging as was used by the Guidance Counselor.

No girl is eligible for this award if she has not been accepted into a college.
